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Summary

Archaeology Wales was commissioned by Pegasus Group on behalf of Fuse Renewables Ltd to carry out a Heritage and Archaeological Desk-Based Assessment in order to assess the likely impacts which could result from the proposed 7MWp solar farm at Talwrn Bach, Llanfyllin, Powys, SY22 5LQ

No Registered Historic Landscape will be directly or indirectly impacted by the proposed development. Within the 3km search area, two Registered Historic Parks and Gardens, Grade II Bryngwyn (PGW(Po)41(POW)) and Grade II Bodynfoel Hall (PGW(Po)42(POW)), were identified. The present assessment indicates that Bryngwyn may experience negligible adverse visual effects, while Bodynfoel Hall will not be impacted.*

No Scheduled Monuments lie within the proposed development boundary, though five (MG210, MG005, MG077, MG228, MG029) fall within the 3km search area. None will be impacted by the proposed development.

Two Conservation Areas lie within the 3km search area, although none fall within the site boundary. The proposed development would not result in visual impacts on either Conservation Area.

No Listed Buildings are located within the site boundary. Fifty-four are recorded within the 3km search area. Of these, six, LB7627 Bodynfoel and Tanrhiw Farmhouses; LB7662 Pentre; LB8612 Barn & Cartshed Range at Green Hall; LB8682 Ty-Côch Talwrn; LB8710 Bryngwyn Hall; and LB8711 Stables & Coach House at Bryngwyn Hall, have potential intervisibility with the proposed development. Assessment indicates no change to LBs 8612, 8710 and 8711, negligible adverse impacts to LB7627 and LB8682, with Pentre (LB7662) likely to experience a minor adverse effect due to clearer views from parts of the site.

Within the 1.5km search area, 191 HER records and ten RCAHMW records were identified, twenty of which relate to designated assets. No HER records lie within the proposed development area itself, although one, former Llanfyllin branch of the Cambrian Railway (PRN78821), lies on its south-eastern boundary. A minimum 5m maintenance strip between the site boundary and perimeter fencing should ensure there are no physical impacts on the embankment. There will be visual impacts from the development along the entire stretch of the railway adjacent to the site. The potential impacts are considered to be Minor adverse.

The site appears to have experienced no major ground impacts, suggesting good preservation below plough levels. Its raised position between two watercourses makes it potentially favourable for prehistoric settlement, ritual, or funerary activity, while

medieval agricultural use is indicated by ridge and furrow (PRN128355) and the field-name Maes y Groes. Post-medieval activity includes the Cambrian Railway (PRN78821). A geophysical survey at the pre-determination stage is recommended to assess sub-surface potential.

Within the 3km search area, two Registered Parks and Gardens, two Conservation Areas, 54 Listed Buildings, and five Scheduled Monuments have been identified. While no direct impacts are expected, their settings could be affected. A Stage 1 Settings Assessment is currently being undertaken to identify which assets require further detailed consideration.

Cafodd Archaeology Wales ei gomisiynu gan Pegasus Group ar ran Fuse Renewables Ltd i gynnal Asesiad Desg Treftadaeth ac Archeolegol er mwyn asesu'r effaith bosibl a allai ddeillio o'r fferm solar 7MWp arfaethedig ym Talwrn Bach, Llanfyllin, Powys, SY22 5LQ.

Ni fydd unrhyw Dirwedd Hanesyddol Gofrestredig yn cael ei heffeithio'n uniongyrchol nac yn anuniongyrchol gan y datblygiad arfaethedig. O fewn yr ardal chwilio o 3km, nodwyd dau Barc a Gardd Cofrestredig, Gradd II Bryngwyn (PGW(Po)41(POW)) a Gradd II Neuadd Bodynfoel (PGW(Po)42(POW)). Mae'r asesiad presennol yn nodi y gallai Bryngwyn wynebu effeithiau gweledol niweidiol prin, tra na fydd Neuadd Bodynfoel yn cael ei heffeithio.*

Nid oes unrhyw Henebion Cofrestredig wedi'u lleoli o fewn ffiniau'r datblygiad arfaethedig, er bod pump (MG210, MG005, MG077, MG228, MG029) o fewn yr ardal chwilio o 3km. Ni fydd yr un ohonynt yn cael eu heffeithio gan y datblygiad arfaethedig.

Mae dwy Ardal Gadwraeth o fewn yr ardal chwilio o 3km, er nad yw yr un ohonynt o fewn ffiniau'r safle. Ni fyddai'r datblygiad arfaethedig yn achosi unrhyw effaith weledol ar unrhyw un o'r Ardaloedd Cadwraeth hyn.

Ni chafodd unrhyw Adeiladau Cofrestredig eu lleoli o fewn ffiniau'r safle. Cofnodir 54 o fewn yr ardal chwilio o 3km. O'r rhain, mae chwech, LB7627 Ffermydd Bodynfoel a Tanrhiw; LB7662 Pentre; LB8612 Ysgubor a Sied Certi yn Green Hall; LB8682 Ty-Côch Talwrn; LB8710 Neuadd Bryngwyn; a LB8711 Stablau a Thŷ Ceir yn Neuadd Bryngwyn, â photensial i fod yn weledol o'r datblygiad arfaethedig. Mae'r asesiad yn nodi dim newid i LB8612, LB8710 ac LB8711, effeithiau niweidiol prin yn bennaf i LB7627 a LB8612, tra bo Pentre (LB7662) yn debygol o wynebu effaith niweidiol fach oherwydd golygfeydd cliriach o rannau o'r safle.

O fewn yr ardal chwilio o 1.5km, nodwyd 191 o gofnodion HER a deng cofnod RCAHMMW, gydag ugain ohonynt yn ymwneud â'r asedau penodedig. Nid oes unrhyw gofnodion HER o fewn ardal y datblygiad arfaethedig ei hun, er bod un, cangen flaenorol Llanfyllin o Reilffordd Cambrian (PRN78821), yn gorwedd ar ei ffin dde-orllewinol. Dylai strïbed cynnal a chadw o 5m o leiaf rhwng ffin y safle a'r ffens o'i amgylch sicrhau na fydd unrhyw effeithiau ffisegol ar yr arglawdd. Ni fydd unrhyw effeithiau gweledol o'r datblygiad ar hyd holl dir y rheilffordd ger y safle. Ystyrir bod yr effeithiau posibl yn gymedrol niweidiol.

Mae'n ymddangos nad yw'r safle wedi profi unrhyw effaith sylweddol ar y ddaear, gan awgrymu cadwraeth dda o dan lefelau plannu. Mae ei leoliad wedi'i godi rhwng dwy afon fach yn ei gwneud yn bosibl ei fod yn addas ar gyfer preswyliaeth, defodau neu weithgaredd angladdol, tra bod defnydd amaethyddol canoloesol yn cael ei awgrymu gan y gefn a'r rhych (PRN128355) a'r enw cae Maes y Groes. Mae gweithgaredd ôl-ganoloesol yn cynnwys y Rheilffordd Cambrian (PRN78821). Argymhellir arolwg daearyddol ar y cam cyn penderfynu i asesu'r potensial tanddaearol.

O fewn yr ardal chwilio o 3km, nodwyd dau Barc a Gardd Cofrestredig, dwy Ardal Gadwraeth, 54 o Adeiladau Cofrestredig, a phump o Henebion Cofrestredig. Er na ddisgwylir unrhyw effaith uniongyrchol, mae'n bosibl y bydd eu lleoliadau'n cael eu heffeithio. Ar hyn o bryd, mae Asesiad Lefel 1 o'r Lleoliadau yn cael ei gynnal i nodi pa asedau sydd angen ystyriaeth fanylach pellach.

1. Introduction

- 1.1.1. Archaeology Wales (AW) was commissioned by Pegasus Group on behalf of Fuse Renewables Ltd (henceforth 'the Client') to carry out a Heritage and Archaeological Desk-Based Assessment (DBA) in order to assess the likely impacts which could result from the proposed 7MWp solar farm at Talwrn Bach, Llanfyllin, Powys, SY22 5LQ - National Grid Reference (NGR) SJ 17648 18931 (Figure 1-2).
- 1.1.2. The DBA will provide information of sufficient detail to allow informed planning decisions to be made, the requirements of which are set out in Planning Policy Wales (Edition 12, February 2024), Section 6.1 and Technical Advice Note (TAN) 24: The Historic Environment (2017). This will enable the client to safeguard and/or seek to minimise harm to the heritage resource. Preservation in situ is advocated where at all possible, but where engineering or other factors could result in the loss of archaeological features, preservation by record is recommended.
- 1.1.3. All work will conform to the *Standard and Guidance for Historic Environment Desk Based Assessment* (CIfA, 2020) and be undertaken by suitably qualified staff to the highest professional standards.

2. Site Description

- 2.1.1. The proposed development area comprises two separate parcels of greenfield agricultural land covering approximately 9.4 hectares. It is located around 2km south-west of Llanfechain, Powys, in the Afon Cain valley, at Talwrn Bach, Llanfyllin, Powys, SY22 5LQ, NGR SJ 17648 18931 (Figures 1-2).

- 2.1.2. The fields form a triangular-shaped area between the B4393 to the west, a former railway embankment to the south-east and a farm track to the north. They are divided by a roughly north-northwest to south-southeast aligned hedgerow, with the southern field being the smaller of the two. The site sits at around 100m aOD. The lowest part of the site is the north-west corner, and there is a gradual slope upwards to south and east.
- 2.1.3. The surrounding landscape is predominantly rural, characterised by open fields, hedgerows, and dispersed farmsteads. Access to the site is obtained from the B4393 road, which runs along the western boundary of the proposed development area.
- 2.1.4. The underlying geology is defined by the Allt-tair-ffynnon Formation, composed of siltstone and mudstone interbedded, formed during the Ordovician Period. Superficial deposits vary across the site. In the south-eastern is a band of Devensian Till diamiction, a detrital sedimentary deposit of glacial origin, formed in the Quaternary Period, between 116,000 and 11,800 years ago. The north-western area has alluvial deposits of clay, silt, sand and gravel, detrital sedimentary deposits formed by river channels, floodplains or levees in the Quaternary period, from 2.588 million years ago to present. There is a small pocket of Devensian sand and gravel glaciofluvial deposits in the central northern area, also dating to the Quaternary Period, 116,000 and 11,800 years ago. (BGS 2026).

3. Methodology

- 3.1.1. The primary objective of this DBA is to assess the potential impact of the development proposals on the historic environment. This will help inform future decision making, design solutions and potential mitigation strategies. The aim is to make full and effective use of existing information in establishing

the heritage/archaeological significance of the site to elucidate the presence or absence of heritage/archaeological material, its character, distribution, extent, condition and relative significance.

- 3.1.2. The work includes a comprehensive assessment of regional context within which the heritage/archaeological evidence resides and aims to highlight any relevant research issues within national and regional research frameworks.
- 3.1.3. This report provides information of sufficient detail to allow informed planning decisions to be made which can safeguard the heritage/archaeological resource.
- 3.1.4. Preservation in situ has been advocated where at all possible, but where engineering or other factors could result in the loss of archaeological deposits, preservation by record has been recommended.
- 3.1.5. This assessment considers the following:
 - a) The nature, extent, and degree of survival of archaeological sites, structures, deposits, and landscapes within the study area through assessment of various readily available primary sources:
 - Collation and assessment of all relevant information held in the regional Historic Environment Record (HER), within a 1.5km study area surrounding the development.
 - Collation and assessment of the impact on all Designated archaeological sites (Scheduled Monuments, Listed Buildings, Historic Parks and Gardens, landscapes, Conservation Areas) within a 3km study area around the proposed development.
 - Assessment of all available excavation reports and archives including unpublished and unprocessed material affecting the site and its setting.
 - Assessment of aerial photographic and satellite imagery evidence.
 - Assessment of archive records held at the County Archive, the

National Library of Wales (NLW) and the Royal Commission on Ancient and Historical Monuments in Wales (RCAHMW).

- Records held by the developer e.g. bore-hole logs, geological/geomorphological information, aerial photographs, maps, plans.
- Map regression analysis using all relevant cartographic sources e.g. all editions of the Ordnance Survey County Series, Tithe and early estate maps (as available).
- Place-name evidence.
- Historic documents (e.g. charters, registers, estate papers).

- b) The significance of any remains in their context both regionally and nationally and in light of the findings of the desk-based study.
- c) The history of the site.
- d) The potential impact of any proposed development on the setting of known sites of heritage/archaeological importance.
- e) The potential for further heritage/archaeological remains to be present, which have not been identified in pre-existing archaeological records.
- f) The potential for further work, with recommendations where appropriate for a suitable investigative and/or mitigation methodology.

3.1.6. In assessing the value of heritage/archaeological assets, and the potential impacts upon them by the proposed development, the terms and guidance used in the *Design Manual for Roads and Bridges, LA104* (Highways England et al., 2020) has been utilised. Values are given as:

4. Archaeological and Historical Background

4.1. Previous archaeological studies

- 4.1.1. There are nineteen previous archaeological studies recorded on the HER within the 1.5km study area, three of which are directly relevant to the present assessment.
- 4.1.2. In 2015, Trysor carried out a Desk-Based Assessment for a proposed solar array - EPRN124843 (Hall and Sambrook 2015). One of the fields assessed corresponds to the south-eastern field of the current proposed development.
- 4.1.3. The assessment concluded there would be no visual impacts on any Scheduled Monuments. No impacts were identified on the registered park and garden at Bodynfoel (PGW (Po) 42 (POW)) or its internal features, although a moderate visual and setting impact was noted from a limited area on the northern side of the parkland associated with Bryngwyn (PGW (Po) 41 (POW)).
- 4.1.4. No impacts were recorded on conservation areas, and only a low direct impact on a section of the former railway line (PRN 78821) and two post-medieval field boundaries.
- 4.1.5. As the assessed site lies 250m from Efain Newydd Iron Age defended enclosure (PRN2486), the report recommended a watching brief during groundworks.
- 4.1.6. A Historic Environment (HE1) assessment was undertaken by the Clwyd-Powys Archaeological Trust as part of the Tir Gofal scheme. The work formed part of a programme of baseline surveys aimed at identifying and recording known archaeological and historic environment features. Within the applied search area, two of these studies are recorded – EPRN51227 and EPRN51225.

4.2. Identified heritage assets

- 4.2.1. The 1.5 km search area retrieved 191 HER records, along with a further ten

records from the Royal Commission on the Ancient and Historical Monuments of Wales (RCAHMW). No HER records are located within the proposed development area, although one, PRN78821, Cambrian Railway, Llanfyllin branch, forms its south-eastern boundary (Figure 3; Appendix I).

4.2.2. A search of the Portable Antiquities Scheme (PAS) database within a 2km radius of the site retrieved five records:

4.3. The Historic Landscape

4.3.1. The site does not lie within a Registered Historic Landscape (RHL), nor are any

Registered Historic Landscapes located within the applied search area.

- 4.3.2. There are two Registered Park and Gardens (RPG) within the 3km search area: Grade II Bodynfoel Hall (PGW (Po) 42 (POW)) and the Grade II* Bryngwyn (PGW (Po) 41 (POW)) (Figure 4).
- 4.3.3. Bryngwyn (PGW (Po) 41 (POW)) is located 219m south of the southernmost end of the proposed development area. The site was designated in 2022. It comprises 24 hectares of late 18th to early 19th century landscape park and garden surrounding the house (built c. 1773-4 for William Mostyn, designed by architect Robert Mylne) (Cadw 2022a).
- 4.3.4. The site is characterised by a largely unaltered setting with gently undulating glaciated ground, mature parkland trees, a lake of at least 19th century origin, and intact peripheral shelter belts and plantations (ibid). Ornamental gardens adjoin the house and include a ha-ha, formal terraces and paths added c. 1903-1910, and a walled kitchen garden recorded on an 1839 estate map (ibid).
- 4.3.5. Bodynfoel Hall (PGW (Po) 42 (POW)) is located 795m north of the northernmost end of the proposed development area. The RPG was designated in 2022. It is a mid-19th century park and garden which extends across gently rolling ground, centres on Bodynfoel Hall and retains much of its original 19th century layout. It includes a small ornamental lake, formal and informal gardens close to the house, and well-preserved areas of parkland framed by mature trees and shelter belts (Cadw 2022b).
- 4.3.6. The grounds illustrate Victorian approaches to landscape design, blending formal planting near the house with wider picturesque parkland. Surviving features such as tree clumps, walled gardens, and service drives contribute to the historic character and visual coherence of the estate. The relationship between the house, garden, and surrounding farmland enhances the site's

aesthetic and historic value, and it holds strong group value with Bodynfoel Hall and its associated structures (ibid).

- 4.3.7. Bwlch-y-Cibau Conservation Area (WAL/POWY/13) is located 1km south of the southernmost end of the proposed development area. Bwlch-y-Cibau is a small historic settlement designated for its well-preserved 19th century rural character. The designation focuses on the village core, where traditional buildings such as Christ Church and its associated listed features contribute to the area's architectural and historic value. Its rural setting and proximity to scheduled monuments such as Bwlch-y-Cibau Dyke (MG077) and the nearby enclosure (MG210) enhance its wider historic significance (Powys County Council 2017).
- 4.3.8. Llanfechain Conservation Area (WAL/POWY/409) is located 1.6km northeast of the northernmost end of the proposed development area. The Conservation Area covers the historic core of the village. The area is distinguished by traditional village form, heritage buildings, and a setting shaped by its river valley location (Powys County Council 2023).

4.4. Scheduled Monuments

- 4.4.1. No Scheduled Monuments (SM) lie within the boundary of the proposed development. Five SMs are located within the applied search area: Bryngwyn Wood Camp (MG029) 973m southeast of the proposed development area; Bwlch Y Cibau enclosure (MG210) 1.2km south of the proposed development area; Domen Castell Mound and Bailey Castle (MG005) 1.4km northeast of the proposed development area; Bwlch Y Cibau Dike (MG077) 1.7km southeast of the proposed development area, and Derwlwyn Castle Hillfort (MG228) 2.8km northwest of the proposed development area (Figure 4).
- 4.4.2. Bryngwyn Wood Camp (MG029) is a later prehistoric enclosure located on a narrow ridge overlooking the Vyrnwy valley. The site consists of an elongated

earthwork defined by a substantial bank and external ditch on the northern side which curve to form controlled entrances at either end. Additional defensive elements on the western end suggest a complex arrangement typical of Iron Age hillforts or enclosed settlements. The monument occupies a prominent position within the landscape (Cadw 2025a).

- 4.4.3. Bwlch Y Cibau enclosure (MG210) is a later prehistoric oval enclosure, within a single bank and ditch, set on a natural scarp. Although parts of the interior have been disturbed by later activity, the monument remains well preserved and retains high archaeological potential (Cadw 1988).
- 4.4.4. Dolmen Castell Mound and Bailey Castle (MG005) is a motte-and-bailey castle comprising a circular mound with traces of a southern bailey. Likely dating to the early Norman period, it is significant for illustrating medieval defensive practices and Norman control in the Vyrnwy valley (Cadw 2025b).
- 4.4.5. Bwlch Y Cibau Dike (MG077) is a linear earthwork formed by banks and ditches following a natural ridge. Likely prehistoric or early medieval, it is designated for its value in illustrating ancient boundary or defensive systems within the local landscape (Cadw 1932).
- 4.4.6. Derwlwyn Castle Hillfort (MG228) is a prehistoric defended enclosure defined by earthwork banks and ditches on a natural rise. Despite some disturbance from later agriculture, it remains well preserved and is designated for its importance in understanding prehistoric settlement and defensive practices in the region (Cadw 1996).

4.5. Listed Buildings

- 4.5.1. There are no Listed Buildings within the bounds of the proposed development area. There are 54 Listed Buildings within the 3km applied search area, 49 of which are Grade II, and five are Grade II* (Figure 4; Table 2).

- 4.5.2. The closest Listed Buildings to the proposed development area are the Grade II listed Talwrn Bach (LB 82435) located 153m to the west of the proposed development, and the also Grade II listed Ty Côch Talwrn (LB 8682).
- 4.5.3. Talwrn Bach (LB 82435) is a late medieval hall-house east of the B4383 at Llanfechain. The building retains substantial timber framing and was altered in 1640 with the addition of a storeyed plan, central chimney, and later brick extensions. It is listed for its architectural and historic interest as a well-preserved example of a medieval timber-framed house with notable 17th-century modifications (Cadw 2004).
- 4.5.4. Ty Côch Talwrn (LB 8682) is a farmhouse located in the hamlet of Talwrn, Llanfechain. It is a 17th century timber-framed house later modified with brickwork and slate roofing. The building retains much of its original structure and layout, including exposed framing on its main elevation and a central chimney typical of regional vernacular architecture. It is listed for its special architectural and historic interest as a well-preserved example of a traditional Montgomeryshire farmhouse reflecting local building traditions (Cadw 1987).
- 4.5.5. It is worth noting that there are two groups of listed buildings associated with Registered Parks and Gardens in the vicinity: Bodynfoel Hall (LB 8710) and its associated barn (LB 82428) to the north, and Bryngwyn Hall (LB 8710) and stables and coach house (LB 8711) to the south. Both form part of historic estate complexes included within their respective RPG designations.
- 4.5.6. The majority of listed structures documented within the 3km applied search area are of agricultural nature, reflecting the surroundings of the proposed development site. However, two clusters of listed buildings are found within Bwlch-y-Cibau Conservation Area (WAL/POWY/13), and Llanfechain Conservation Area (WAL/POWY/409).

4.6. Known Archaeological Remains and Historical Development

Prehistoric: Palaeolithic (c.450,000 – 10,000 BC), Mesolithic (c.10,000 – 3800 BC), Neolithic (3800 BC – 2300 BC), Bronze Age (2300 BC – 700 BC)

- 4.6.1. The earliest evidence of human activity recorded within the 1.5km study area dates to the Neolithic period. A Neolithic axe was found at Bwlch y Cibau, c. 1.2km south of the proposed development area.
- 4.6.2. Five Bronze Age sites are recorded in the study area. Three of these are based on placename evidence, where the placename refers to a cairn: PRN3940 Cae Carn Ucha, PRN3941 Cae Carnedd, and PRN3942 Cae y Garreg. Gwern enclosure (PRN4606), c. 1.1km to the north-east of the development area, is the southern half of an oval enclosure identified from aerial photography. It measures roughly 70m long, east to west. Dating is based on form, and it may also date to the Iron Age or Roman periods.

Iron Age (700 BC – AD 43) and Roman (AD 43 – c. AD 410)

- 4.6.3. There is greater evidence for activity within the landscape during the Iron Age,

with three defended enclosures recorded in the 1.5km search area, two of which are scheduled monuments. Bryngwyn Wood Camp (MG029, PRN60, NPRN275924) and Bwlch-y-Cibau Enclosure (MG210, PRN62, NPRN94943) are described in the Scheduled Monument section. Gwern enclosure (PRN4606), mentioned above, may also be of Iron Age date.

- 4.6.4. Efail Newydd enclosure (PRN2486) is located 200m to the east of the north-east corner of the proposed development area. The site has been extensively ploughed, and the enclosure is only identifiable from cropmarks. It was probably a double ditched oval enclosure, 80m long east to west and 60m wide. It is cut through the centre by a hedge-lined farm track.
- 4.6.5. There is little evidence of Roman settlement within the landscape, with no sites recorded on the HER or NMR within the 1.5km search area. There are two findspots recorded on the PAS: a silver denarius dating to the period c. AD 130-137 and a fragment of a finger ring.

Early Medieval (c. AD 410 – AD 1086), Medieval (1086 – 1536)

- 4.6.6. The only previously recorded early medieval site in the 1.5km search area is the possible site of the Battle of Mechain, NPRN405112, just under 1.5km to the north-east of the proposed development area. The battle took place in 1070, and saw Bleddyn and Rhiwallon, joint rulers of Powys and Gwynedd defend their title against Idwal and Maredudd, sons of King Gruffydd. Rhiwallon, Idwal and Maredudd all died in the battle, making Bleddyn King of Powys and Gwynedd.
- 4.6.7. There are twelve sites of medieval date recorded in the search area, including one Scheduled Monument (Domen Castell Mound, MG005, PRN1486, NPRN306789) and one Listed Building (Pentre, Llanfechain, LB7622, PRN20272, NPRN29746).
- 4.6.8. Evidence of medieval agricultural activity has been recorded to the south of

the proposed development area, where traces of ridge and furrow cultivation have been identified (PRN 128355). Further medieval activity of an agricultural nature is associated with the origins of nearby farm complexes, including Ty Coch (LB 8682; PRN 21443), located immediately to the north of the site. In the wider landscape, the medieval settlement pattern is represented by villages such as Pentre (Pentre, Llanfechain; LB7622, PRN 20272, NPRN 29746). The area also includes medieval lordship and defensive focal points, notably Domen y Castell (SM MG005), a prominent motte-and-bailey site that illustrates the wider feudal and territorial organisation of the region during the medieval period.

- 4.6.9. It is also worth noting that a field immediately to the south-east of the proposed development area is recorded as Maes-y-Groes on the 1839 tithe map. According to the RCAHMW Place Names Register, this toponym typically denotes the former presence of a medieval cross or a historic crossroads in the vicinity.

Post-medieval (1536 – 1899) & Modern (1900 – present day)

- 4.6.10. Within a 1.5km radius of the proposed development area, most recorded sites date from the post-medieval period. Collectively, they demonstrate how agricultural expansion over the past two centuries have transformed the surrounding landscape. The majority consist of farmsteads, agricultural outbuildings, and domestic dwellings. Examples close to the site include Talwrn Bach, a late medieval hall house that underwent 17th century adaptation (LB 82435; NPRN 21388; PRN 4064), and the farm complex at Glanypwll (PRN 7822), located to the southeast of the proposed development area.
- 4.6.11. Furthermore, the landscape surrounding the proposed development area forms part of the wider historic setting influenced by the Bryngwyn Hall estate (LB8711; NPRN21357; PRN32460), a late 18th century country house set within

an extensive designed parkland of ornamental gardens, woodland plantations, and open pasture that has shaped the character of the local landscape since its creation.

- 4.6.12. Other records reflect the development of the area's transport network during the 18th and 19th centuries, notably the construction of the Cambrian Railway's Llanfyllin Branch Line (PRN78821) through the Cain Valley in the 1860s.

5. Map regression

5.1. **A map of Bryngwyn Demense in the Parish of Llanfechen and county of Montgomery, 1825**

- 5.1.1. This estate map shows Bryngwyn Hall and parkland, as well as adjoining land holdings of the Bryngwyn Estate. It shows the fields to the north of the park, up to and including the proposed development area were owned by the Bryngwyn Estate by this time, as were two fields to the west, including Bryngwyn Cottages, and Bryngwyn wood to the south-east. It documents the development area as consisting of two fields in a layout similar to the existing. A written note indicates that despite being coloured as part of the Estate, the south-western field of the proposed development area was owned by a Mr. Davies.

5.2. **Ordnance Survey Drawings: Meifod, 1829, and Oswestry, 1830, 1:31,680**

- 5.2.1. The early Ordnance Survey (OS) Drawings provide information about the development area and the surrounding landscape. The proposed development area lies just within the boundary of the Meifod area map, with what is now the B4393 forming the north-west boundary between the two map areas.
- 5.2.2. The OS Drawings are not particularly detailed and do not, for example, always

correctly show field boundaries. The proposed development area can be identified by the line of the B4393, which forms its north-west boundary, and the curving track that forms the north boundary. The area is blank, but surrounded by farmsteads, including Glanypwll to the south, Ty-côch (not labelled) to the north, and Glanfroganysaf to the east. Forested areas are shown to the south, around Brangwyn, and south-east along the ridge, now Glanfrogan Hill.

- 5.2.3. The Oswestry map shows the area to the west of the B4393. The track that forms the northern site boundary continues, crossing the Afon Cain. There are two unlabelled farmsteads shown adjacent to the proposed development area that equate to Berllan and Talwrn-bâch. The town of Llanfechan is shown to the north-east, between the road and river, and the enclosed churchyard is clearly depicted. A Mount (MG005) is to the south-west of the town.

5.3. Map of the parish of Llanvechan in the County of Montgomery, 1839

- 5.3.1. The 1839 tithe map provides detail of the fields that make up the proposed development area prior to the construction of the railway (Figure 5). It differs slightly from the 1825 plan, as the northern field was divided in two (Apportionments 721 and 722), the south-western field was part of two small fields (Apportionments 723 and 726). All 726 are listed as being owned and occupied by Martin Williams of Bryngwyn Hall, who has extensive land holdings in the area. They are all listed as arable fields, although there are small enclosures in the corners that suggest they may also have been used for livestock.
- 5.3.2. The southernmost field, Apportionment 726, was part of Wern y Glyn farm, owned by John Abertanat and occupied by David Davies. The rest of this farm's holdings lie to the north-east.
- 5.3.3. The wider landscape was primarily agricultural, with numerous farmsteads in

irregular fieldscapes of later medieval origin with some regular post-medieval enclosures (including the proposed development area). Some of these farms are more substantial, such as Green Hall c. 1km to the west of the development area, and Glanbrogan, c. 650m to the east. There is a mill located c. 200m to the west of the development area on what appears to be a purpose dug mill race.

- 5.3.4. Bryn-gwyn Hall, with its landscaped park, is shown to the south. The small village of Brin Bowllo (modern Bwlch y Cibau) lies south of the park. Llanfechain is a slightly larger settlement straddling the River Cain to the north of the development area.

5.4. Ordnance Survey First Edition, six-inch map of Montgomeryshire X.SW, 1884

- 5.4.1. The most significant change from previous mapping is the construction of the Cambrian Railway Llanfyllin Branch, the route of which now forms the curving south-eastern boundary of the site. Immediately to the south of the development area, where the railway crosses the road, is Bryngwyn Flag Station.
- 5.4.2. The internal field divisions created by the earlier fields in the proposed development area remain, and the boundaries are shown as being tree-lined. A few scattered trees are depicted in the fields. A footpath is shown running along what is now the surviving field boundary from the road, passing under the railway, and turning north-east across the fields to join the Ty-uchaf track.
- 5.4.3. There is little change to the wider landscape other than the construction of the railway. A short stretch of The Brogan has been canalised, c. 250m to the south of the development area. Several small surface quarries and old quarries are marked, mainly in the higher areas such as Bryngwyn Wood in the south and Domen Gastell Hill in the west.

5.4.4. To the west of Bryngwyn Hall, Bryn-derwen Hall had been constructed, including a landscaped park with driveway and entrance lodge, on an area of former fields.

5.5. Ordnance Survey Second Edition, six-inch map of Montgomeryshire, X.SW, 1902

5.5.1. There are no notable changes to the proposed development area or the surrounding area from the First Edition.

5.6. Ordnance Survey six-inch map of Montgomeryshire, X.SW, 1953

5.6.1. There are still no changes to the proposed development area. The only minor change noted in the surrounding area is that the mill race to the mill west of the development area has been filled in.

5.7. Ordnance Survey, six-inch map, SJ11NE – A, 1963

5.7.1. There are no notable changes to the proposed development area or the surrounding area from the previously mapping.

6. Aerial photographs and LiDAR

6.1. Aerial photographs

6.1.1. All aerial photographs of the area were requested from the Welsh Government Central Register of Aerial Photography. Coverage of the area is poor. Photographs from 1947 to modern satellite imagery have been examined; the full list of examined photographs is included in the bibliography.

6.1.2. Aerial imagery from 1947 shows that the southern field within the proposed development area was divided into two distinct parcels, a configuration that appears to remain unchanged at least until 1964. At this stage, the western boundary is notably open and lacks mature tree cover, contrasting with its present appearance. The photographs from the 1940s also reveal that the

Berllan complex to the west was not yet fully developed, resulting in a landscape markedly different from today's arrangement. The 1948 series is particularly valuable, as these images capture the position of the site in relation to the Bryngwyn estate and provide a clear view of the surrounding topography (Figure 6).

- 6.1.3. The two photographs from 1984 were taken on the same day. They show the proposed development area was mainly pasture at this time. Two of the historic field boundaries had been removed by this time, resulting in the existing field layout. Two large trees on the north-west and south-east boundaries of the northern field mark the line of a former boundary. There were established tree lines along the north-west and northern boundaries. The smaller southern field appears to have been bounded by hedgerows. The railway had been dismantled by this time, and along the south-east of the development area it appears to have been used as a trackway.
- 6.1.4. Two photographs from 1997 show that the larger, northern field of the proposed development area was used for arable while the smaller to the south appears to be pasture.
- 6.1.5. There is satellite imagery of the site from 2006. This shows that the trees along the northern site boundary had been removed. The northern field continued to be used for arable while southern field appears to be scrubby pasture, with a small area of trees or bushes in the south corner
- 6.1.6. There is no change to the development area up to 2014. The next image, from 2022, shows that the trees along the north-western boundary had been removed. At this time the southern field was also being used for arable.

6.2. LiDAR

- 6.2.1. A LiDAR Digital Terrain Model (DTM) at a 1m resolution was processed into a multi-directional hillshade model to examine the presence and character of

sub-surface features that may be present on site (Figure 7).

- 6.2.2. The model shows that the proposed development area is located on a low-lying area by the River Cain. There is a small ridge along the south-eastern edge of the fields, which then drops away eastwards down to The Brogan. This ridge aligns with the recorded change in superficial geology.
- 6.2.3. The modern field boundaries and former railway are clearly visible. The fields of the development area have been subject to modern ploughing and are largely featureless. In the west of the northern field is an irregularly shaped mound, about 70m long by 40m wide, with what may be a shallow hollow to the south-west. This could be the remains of surface quarrying, although none has been shown here on the historic mapping, and it is notable that this is roughly the location of a glaciofluvial deposit recorded as part of the superficial geology (BGS 2026).
- 6.2.4. There is a curvilinear feature, c. 50m long, in the south-east of the northern field. It is not clear what this may represent.

7. Site visit

- 7.1.1. A site visit was conducted on the 18th to 20th November 2025, in generally sunny but cold conditions. Visibility was good. The site was fully accessible, although heavily waterlogged in the north-west.
- 7.1.2. The site is located in the Afon Cain river valley, with the river meandering roughly parallel to the B4393, less than 150m to the west of the site. It sits on a slight rise between the Avon Cain and the small tributary stream The Brogan, c. 250m to the south-east. The river valley is flat, with gentle undulations, while it is flanked to the east and west by hills.
- 7.1.3. The survey confirmed that the site comprises two pasture fields to the north-

west of a roughly north-east to south-west orientated rise (Plates 1 and 2). The embankment of the former Llanfyllin branch of the Cambrian Railway (PRN78821), now used as an access track, runs along the south-east of the site (Plate 3).

- 7.1.4. There is a post and wire fence on the south-eastern boundary, with mature trees along the railway embankment (Plate 4). The northern boundary is a hedgerow with some trees (Plate 5). The boundary along the B4393 is a hedgerow with occasional trees (Plate 6). There are frequent large stumps of a former mature tree row (Plate 7). There is a small cluster of conifers in the south-west corner of the small field (Plate 8). The internal boundary is a hedge topped low bank (Plate 9). There was no evidence of the line of the former field boundary observed on the historic mapping (Plate 10).
- 7.1.5. The mound observed on the LiDAR data in the west of the northern field was visible on the ground as a low rounded rise (Plate 11). It is not clear what this represents, and it may be a natural feature.
- 7.1.6. No previously unidentified archaeological assets were identified during the site visit.
- 7.1.7. Prior to the site visit, a Zone of Theoretical Visibility (ZTV) model was produced on the basis of arrays across the site area at a height of 2.7m (Figure 8). The site visit determined that the visibility of the proposed development predicted by the ZTV was largely correct. Views to the north-east of the site are blocked by a low rise just to the north of the proposed development area (Plate 12). Views along the valley to the south-west are blocked by tall hedgerows and trees due to the relatively flat topography (Plate 13). However, the low hill ridges to the north-west and south-east of the valley were clearly visible from large parts of the site.

8. Impact Assessment

8.1. Previous Impacts

- 8.1.1. Previous impacts across the proposed development area are of great significance in determining the survival and importance of the known and potential archaeological resource.
- 8.1.2. The historic field boundaries, observed during the assessment and largely present today, indicate that the site has been enclosed fields since at least the early post-medieval period. Although currently used as pasture, map regression and aerial photography demonstrates that they have previously been under arable cultivation and ploughing will have impacted on any buried remains within plough depth.
- 8.1.3. The construction of the Llanfyllin Branch railway in the mid-19th century removed previous field boundaries and would have caused disturbance to the surrounding fields, including possibly taking soil to build the embankment.

8.2. Potential Impacts of the Proposed Development

- 8.2.1. The proposed development is in the pre-planning stages. It is known that the proposed development comprises the construction of a solar farm. Details on ground anchoring techniques have yet to be determined, although it is foreseen that the panels will not exceed 2.7m in height (Figure 9).
- 8.2.2. The proposal may include the following: 1) photovoltaic panels, 2) power storage units, 3) mounting frames, 4) inverters, transformers and associated cabling, 5) distributor network operator substation, 6) onsite substations, 7) deer fencing, 8) internal service road and access.
- 8.2.3. Any of the following activities associated with the proposed development could therefore expose, damage or destroy archaeological remains:
 - Surface stripping and levelling;

- Construction of infrastructure
- Service installation;
- Any other ground disturbing works.

8.3. Historic Landscapes

- 8.3.1. No Registered Historic Landscape will not be directly affected by any development.
- 8.3.2. There are no Registered Historic Parks and Gardens within the site boundary. Two RHPGs lies within the 3km search area: Grade II* Bryngwyn (PGW(Po)41(POW)) and Grade II Bodynfoel Hall (PGW(Po)42(POW)). As RHPG these sites are deemed to have a **High** heritage value.
- 8.3.3. Bryngwyn is located 360m from the proposed development area at its closest point. The parkland covers the summit and slopes of a small hill, meaning the north-facing slopes are towards the development area. The ZTV model indicated that there would be partial views of the proposed development from the upper, north-west facing slopes. As the site area slopes slightly north-west, away from the RHPG, and the raised, tree-lined railway embankment lies between them, these views will be minimal, as confirmed by the site visit. It is considered that the proposed development would have a **Negligible adverse** impact.
- 8.3.4. The site visit established that there would be no impacts on Bodynfoel Hall RHPG.

8.4. Scheduled Monuments

- 8.4.1. No Scheduled Monuments lie within the boundary of the proposed development. There are five SMs within the 3km search area. As SMs they are all considered to be of **High** value.
- 8.4.2. The ZTV and site visit established that four of the SMs (MG210, MG005,

MG077, and MG228) would not be impacted by the proposed development.

- 8.4.3. Bryngwyn Wood Camp (MG029) is located on a prominent ridge 1.1km to the south-east of the proposed development area. The ridge is clearly visible from nearly all of the proposed development area. The hill, including the hillfort itself, is densely wooded with deciduous trees. Although the trees had dropped their leaves, views toward the site from the hill were patchily screened. The site itself was further screened by the railway embankment. It is therefore considered that the proposed development would result in **No change** to the SM.

8.5. Conservation Areas and Listed Buildings

- 8.5.1. There are no Conservation Areas within the site boundary, but two lie within the 3km search area. The ZTV and site visit established that due to the local topography there would be no visual impacts on either Conservation Area.
- 8.5.2. There are no Listed Buildings within the site boundary. Fifty-four Listed Buildings are located within the 3km search area. The ZTV and site visit established that of these, six have the potential to be impacted by the proposed development: LB7627, Bodynfoel and Tanrhiw Farmhouses; LB7662 Pentre; LB8612, Barn & Cartshed Range at Green Hall; LB8682, Ty-Côch Talwrn, LB8710, Bryngwyn Hall; 8711, Stables and Coach House at Bryngwyn Hall. Of these, Bryngwyn Hall is Grade II* and the rest are Grade II. As Listed Buildings they are of **High** heritage value.
- 8.5.3. Bodynfoel and Tanrhiw Farmhouses (LB7627) are located on a south-facing hillslope, 2.4km to the north of the proposed development area. The ZTV indicated there may be some visibility of the site from the building. The site visit established that there are clear views of the farmhouse from the higher parts of the fields. The distance from the development and the relatively small section of the site visible indicates that the impacts of the proposed

development are likely to be **Negligible adverse**.

- 8.5.4. Pentre (LB7662) is located 750m to the north of the proposed development area, on a slight plateau overlooking the Afon Cain valley. The building was visible from all of the proposed development area. It was not possible to access the building during the site visit, but the visual impacts are likely to be **Minor adverse**.
- 8.5.5. The Barn & Cartshed Range at Green Hall (LB8612) is located 1.1km to the west of the proposed development area. The ZTV indicated there may be visibility of a small part of the proposed development. The building is taller than the associated modern farm buildings to its east, meaning its second storey could be seen from the north-east corner of the site. There is unlikely to be any visibility from ground level. The impacts of the proposed development are likely to be **No change**.
- 8.5.6. Ty-Côch Talwrn (LB8682) is located 200m to the north of the proposed development area. The site visit confirmed that there are views of the upper half of the building from most of the proposed development area. It was not possible to access the building during the site visit, but views from the asset at ground level are likely to be restricted by hedgerows. The impacts of the proposed development are likely to be **Negligible adverse**.
- 8.5.7. Bryngwyn Hall (LB8710) is located 700m to the south-east of the proposed development area, at the highest point of Bryngwyn RHPG. The ZTV indicates some potential visual impacts on the building, although likely significantly obscured by a building to the north-west (LB8711) and the park woodland. The site visit confirmed that there were no views of the building from the site. The impacts of the proposed development are considered to be **No change**.
- 8.5.8. The Stables & Coach House at Bryngwyn Hall (LB8711) is located immediately to the north-west of Bryngwyn Hall. The ZTV indicated there may be some

visibility of the proposed development, but the site visit established these would largely be screened by trees within Bryngwyn park and by the railway embankment. The impacts of the proposed development are likely to be **No change**.

8.6. Non-designated sites

- 8.6.1. There are 191 HER records, along with a further ten records from the RCAHMW, with the 1.5 km search area. Twenty of these relate to designated assets. No HER records are located within the proposed development area.
- 8.6.2. The former Llanfyllin branch of the Cambrian Railway (PRN78821) forms the south-eastern boundary of the proposed development area. The raised embankment is now used as a farm access track but will not be used to provide access to the development area. The existing development proposals include a minimum 5m maintenance strip between the site boundary and perimeter fencing, which should also prevent physical impacts on the embankment from the development. There will be visual impacts from the development proposal, as the raised and central location of the embankment means that the parts of the development will be visible along the entire stretch of the railway that runs adjacent to the development area. The potential impacts on this section of the former railway are considered to be **Minor adverse**.
- 8.6.3. A cluster of five non-designated post-medieval farm buildings are located at Glan-y-pwll farm, c. 100m to the south of the proposed development area. There are views of the upper parts of these buildings from the higher ground in the north-east of the northern field. Visual impacts on these assets are considered to be **Negligible adverse**.

9. Mitigation

- 9.1.1. The assessment of the site indicates that no major ground impacts have previously occurred, suggesting that archaeological deposits may be well preserved below current plough levels.
- 9.1.2. The area occupies a piece of raised ground between two watercourses, a topographic setting that is typically favourable for earlier settlement, ritual, or funerary activity. This is supported by the wider distribution of prehistoric monuments and findspots in the locality, including the Efain Newydd Iron Age defended enclosure (PRN2486), located only a short distance away.
- 9.1.3. During the medieval period, the area was likely under agricultural use, as suggested, for instance, by the presence of ridge and furrow (PRN 128355) nearby. In addition, the nearby field name Maes y Groes provides further indication that medieval activity should not be discounted.
- 9.1.4. As previously noted, post-medieval activity within the proposed development area is represented by the Cambrian Railway (PRN78821), which forms a significant element of the site's historic landscape and contributes to the understanding of its later development.
- 9.1.5. Given this combined archaeological potential, it is recommended to undertake a geophysical survey at the pre-determination stage to help establish the sub-surface character of the site and to inform any further requirements.
- 9.1.6. The assessment has identified two Registered Parks and Gardens, two Conservation Areas, 54 Listed Buildings, and five Scheduled Monuments within the 3km search area. While no direct physical impacts are anticipated on any designated assets, the proposed development has the potential to affect their settings, understood as the surroundings in which a heritage asset is experienced, and which contribute to its significance, character and

appreciation.

- 9.1.7. A Stage 1 Settings Assessment is currently being undertaken to determine which of these assets require more detailed consideration. It is recommended that the results of the Stage 1 assessment, together with Cadw's response, is used to determine which assets should progress to a full settings assessment at the next stage.

10. Conclusions

- 10.1.1. No Registered Historic Landscape will be directly or indirectly impacted by the proposed development. Within the 3km search area, two Registered Historic Parks and Gardens, Grade II* Bryngwyn (PGW(Po)41(POW)) and Grade II Bodynfoel Hall (PGW(Po)42(POW)), were identified. The present assessment indicates that Bryngwyn may experience negligible adverse visual effects, while Bodynfoel Hall will not be impacted.
- 10.1.2. No Scheduled Monuments lie within the proposed development boundary, though five (MG210, MG005, MG077, MG228, MG029) fall within the 3km search area. None will be impacted by the proposed development.
- 10.1.3. Two Conservation Areas lie within the 3km search area, although none fall within the site boundary. The proposed development would not result in visual impacts on either Conservation Area.
- 10.1.4. No Listed Buildings are located within the site boundary. Fifty-four are recorded within the 3km search area. Of these, six, LB7627 Bodynfoel and Tanrhiw Farmhouses; LB7662 Pentre; LB8612 Barn & Cartshed Range at Green Hall; LB8682 Ty-Côch Talwrn; LB8710 Bryngwyn Hall; and LB8711 Stables & Coach House at Bryngwyn Hall, have potential intervisibility with the proposed development. Assessment indicates no change to LBs 8612, 8710 and 8711,

negligible adverse impacts to LB7627 and LB8682, with Pentre (LB7662) likely to experience a minor adverse effect due to clearer views from parts of the site.

- 10.1.5. Within the 1.5km search area, 191 HER records and ten RCAHMW records were identified, twenty of which relate to designated assets. No HER records lie within the proposed development area itself, although one, the former Llanfyllin branch of the Cambrian Railway (PRN78821) forms the south-eastern boundary. The raised embankment will not be physically impacted by the proposed development, but there will be clear views of the site from it, considered to have a minor adverse impact.
- 10.1.6. The site appears to have experienced no major ground impacts, suggesting good preservation below plough levels. Its raised position between two watercourses makes it potentially favourable for prehistoric settlement, ritual, or funerary activity, while medieval agricultural use is indicated by ridge and furrow (PRN128355) and the field name Maes y Groes. Post-medieval activity includes the Cambrian Railway (PRN78821). A geophysical survey at the pre-determination stage is recommended to assess sub-surface potential.
- 10.1.7. Within the 3km search area, two Registered Parks and Gardens, two Conservation Areas, fifty-four Listed Buildings, and five Scheduled Monuments have been identified. While no direct impacts are expected, their settings could be affected. A Stage 1 Settings Assessment is underway to identify which assets require further detailed consideration. It is recommended that the results of the Stage 1 assessment, together Cadw's response, is used to determine which assets should progress to a full settings assessment at the next stage.

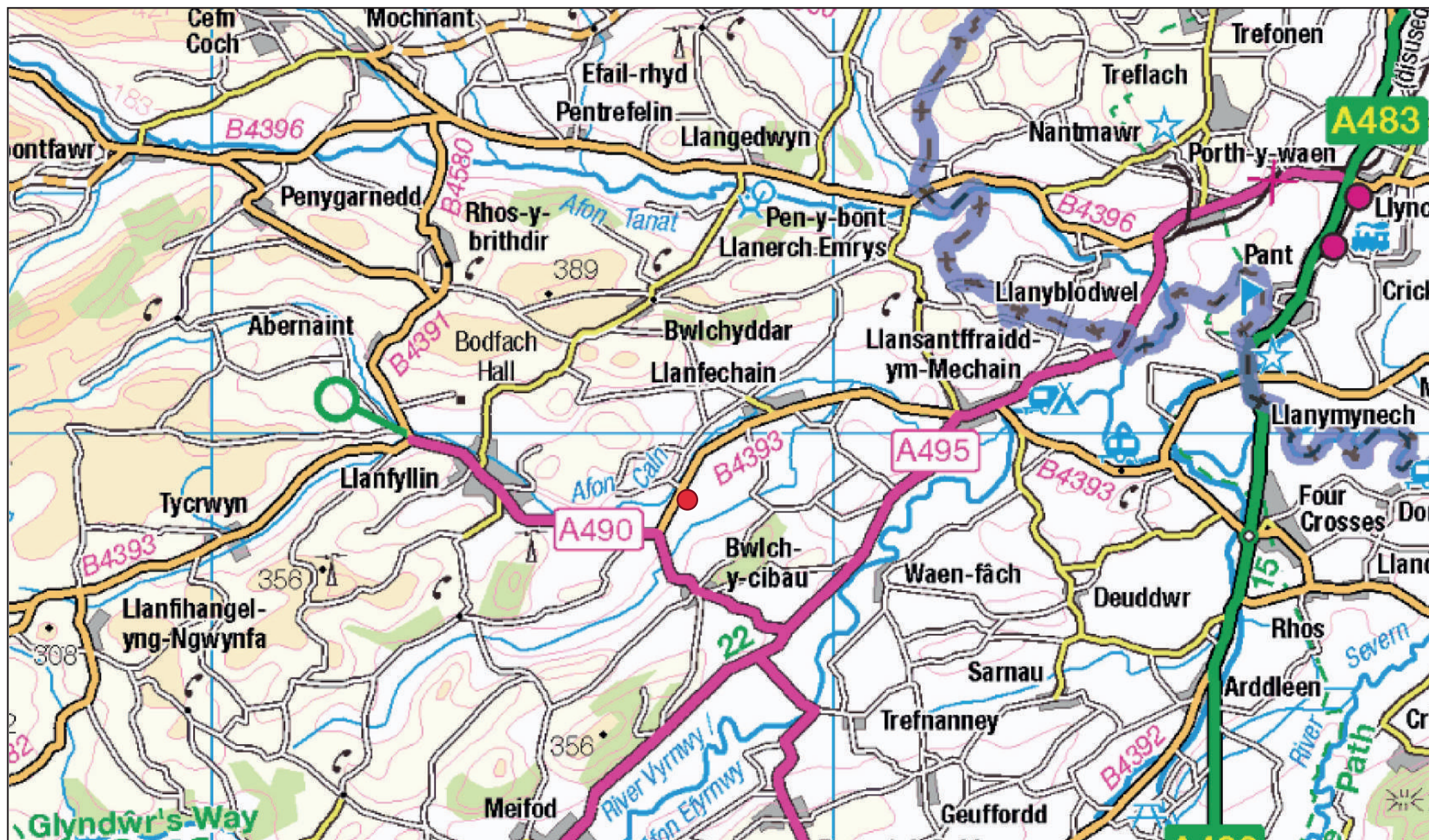


Figure 1. Site location

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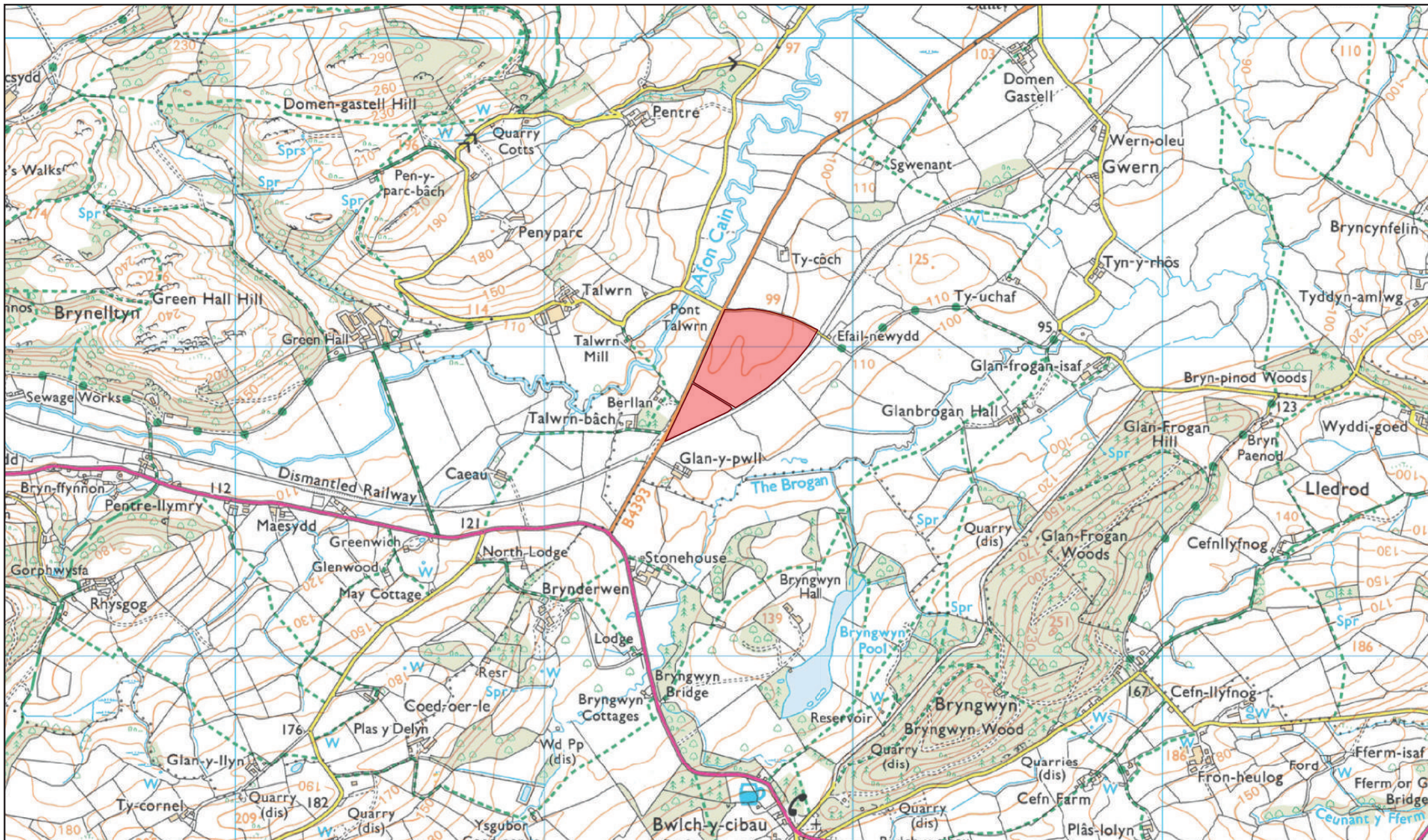


Figure 2. Proposed development area.

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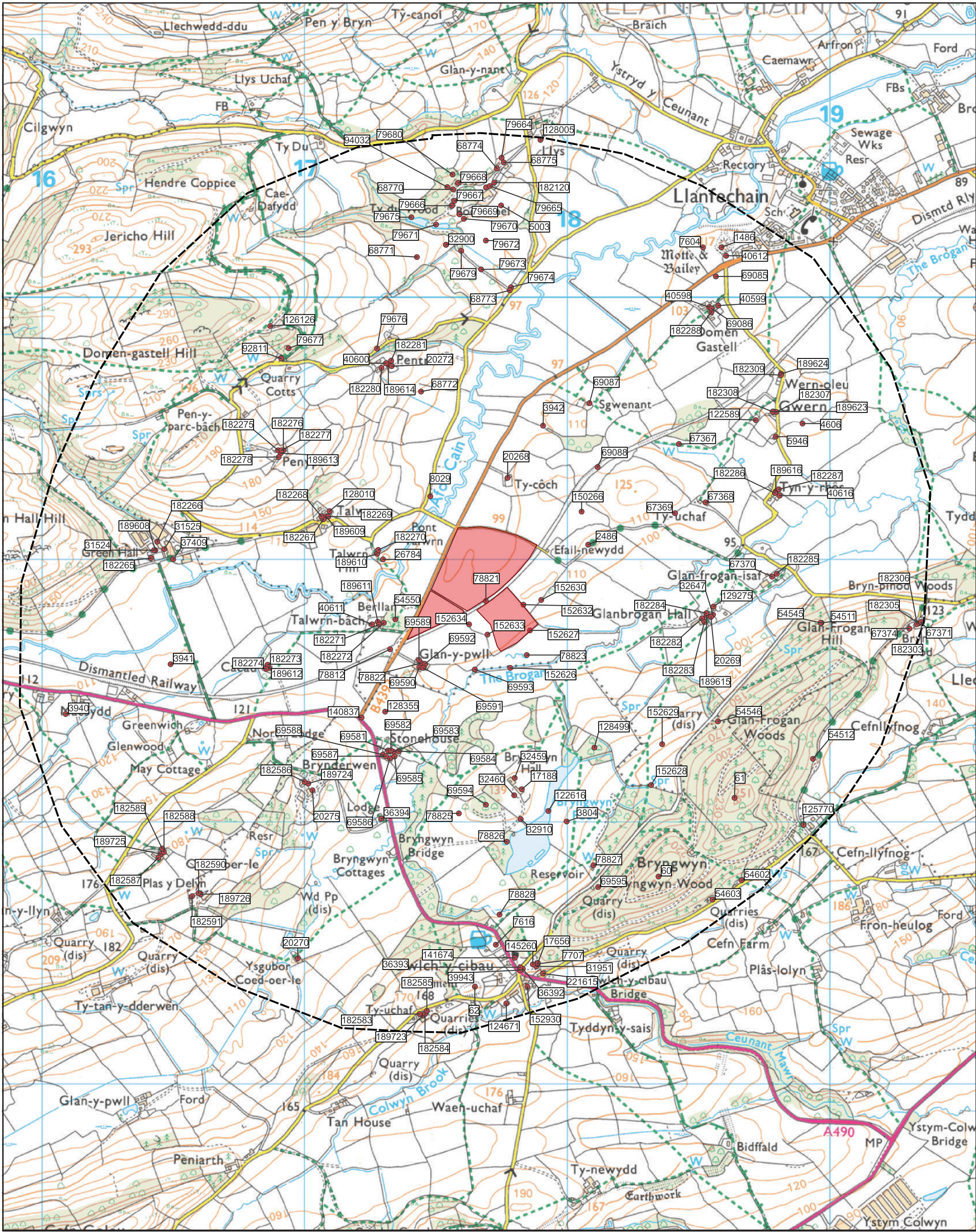


Figure 3. All heritage assets within 1.5km search area.



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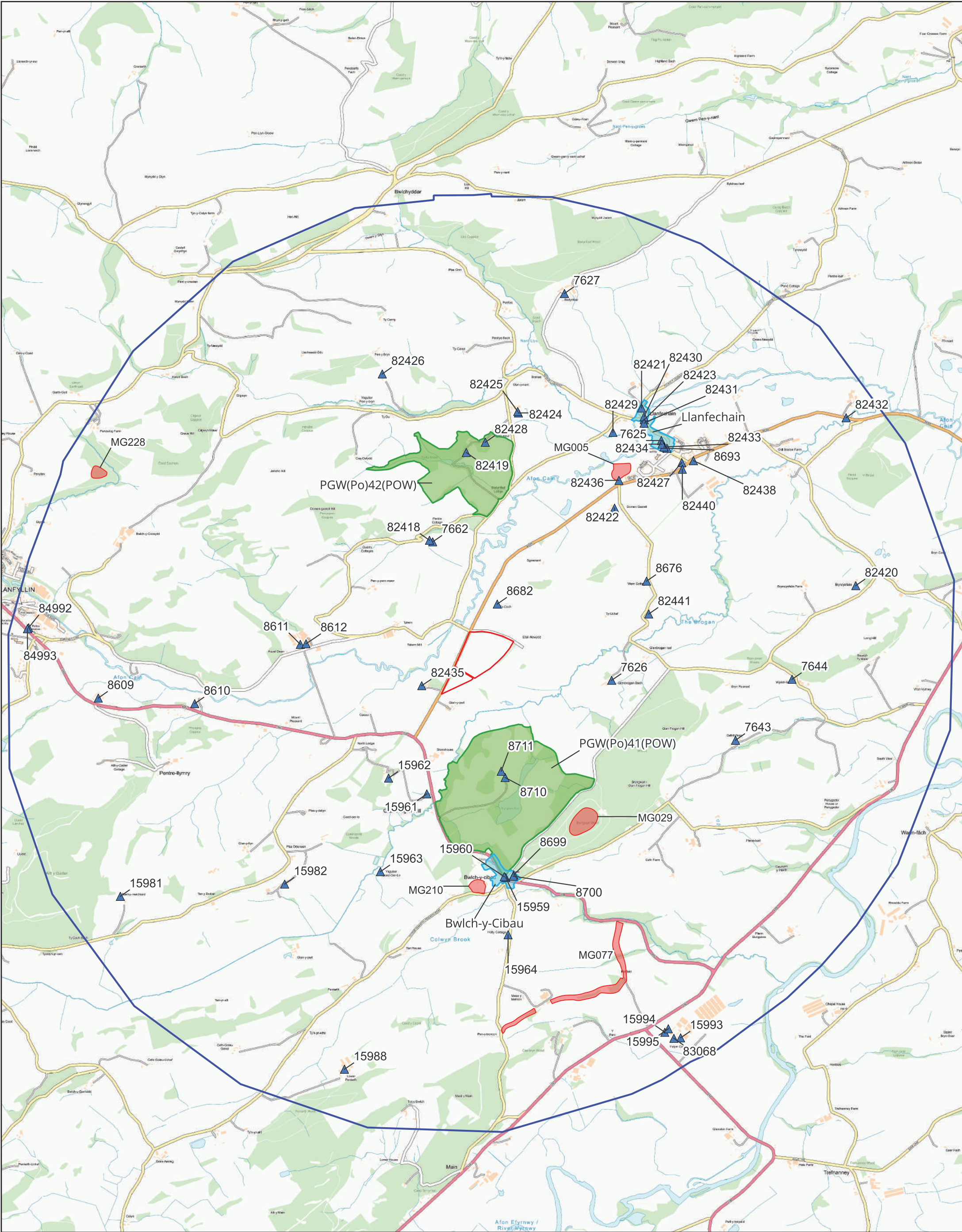


Figure 4. Designated assets within the 3km Study Area

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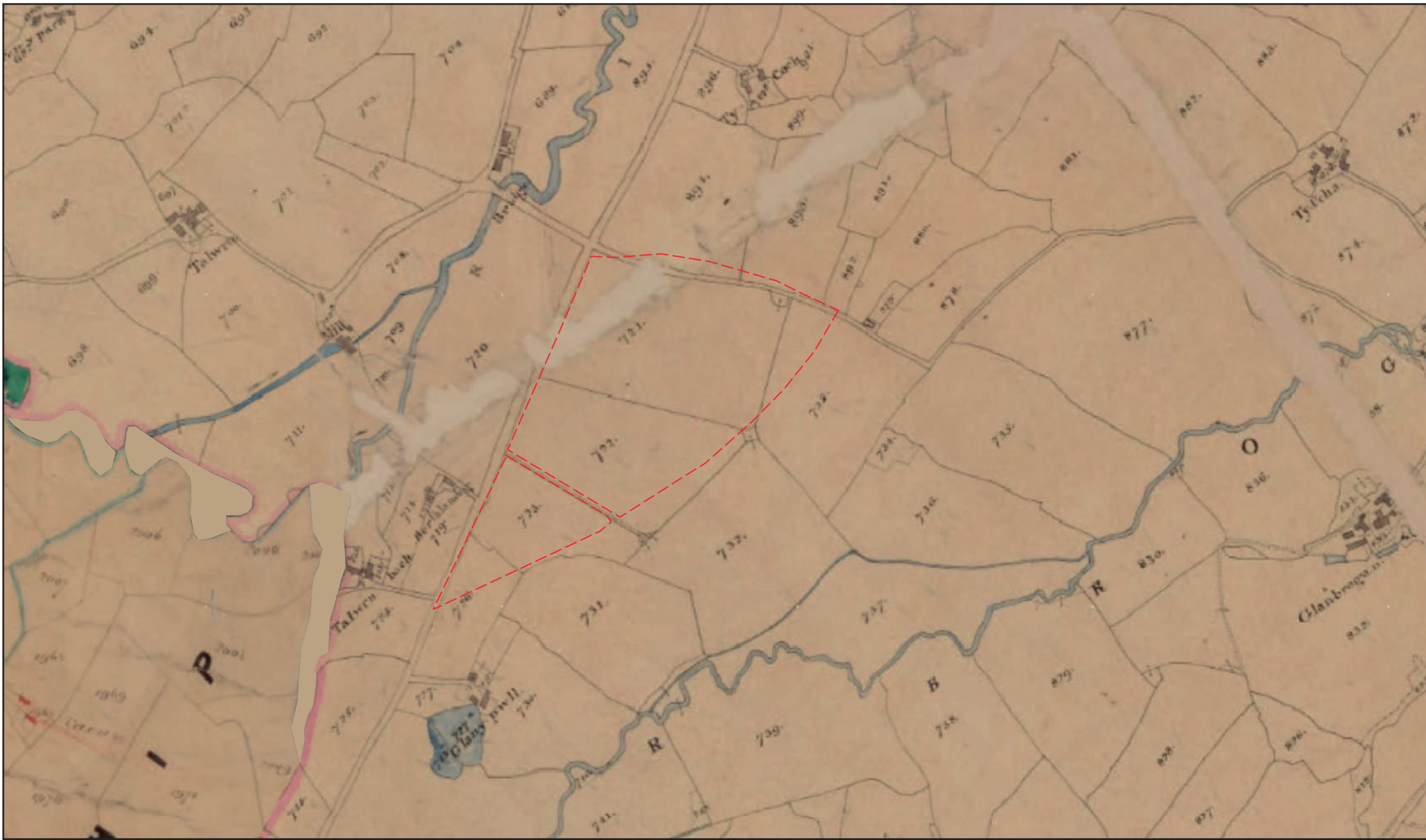


Figure 5. Map of the parish of Llanvechan in the County of Montgomery 1839.

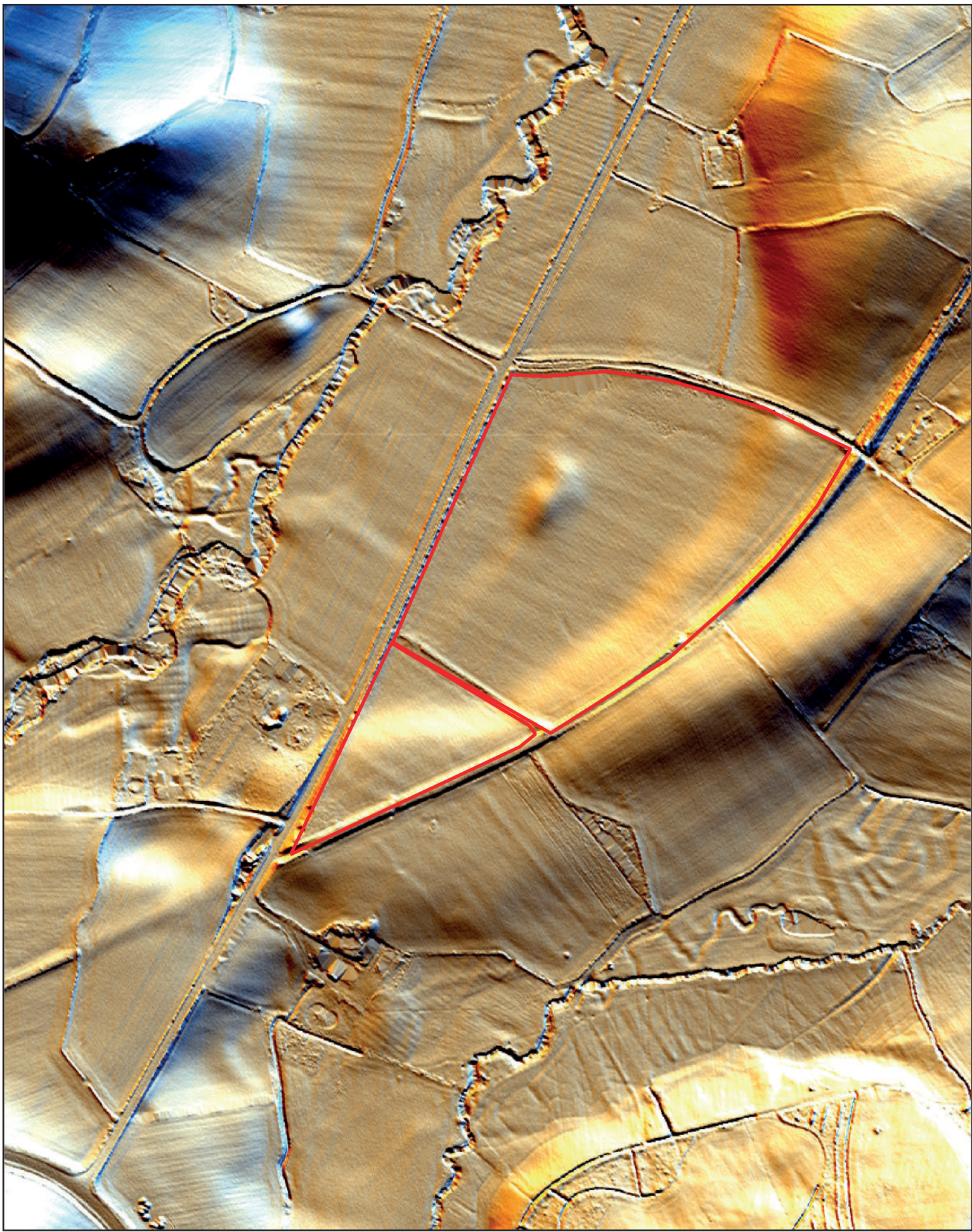


Figure 7. LiDAR 1m DTM - Hillshade

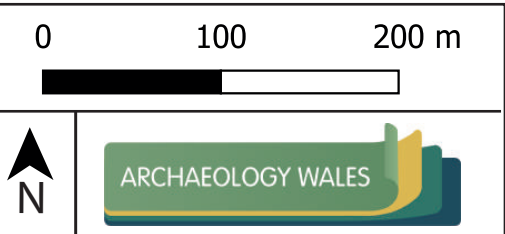




Figure 8. ZTV analysis for the proposed development works showing the potential visibility

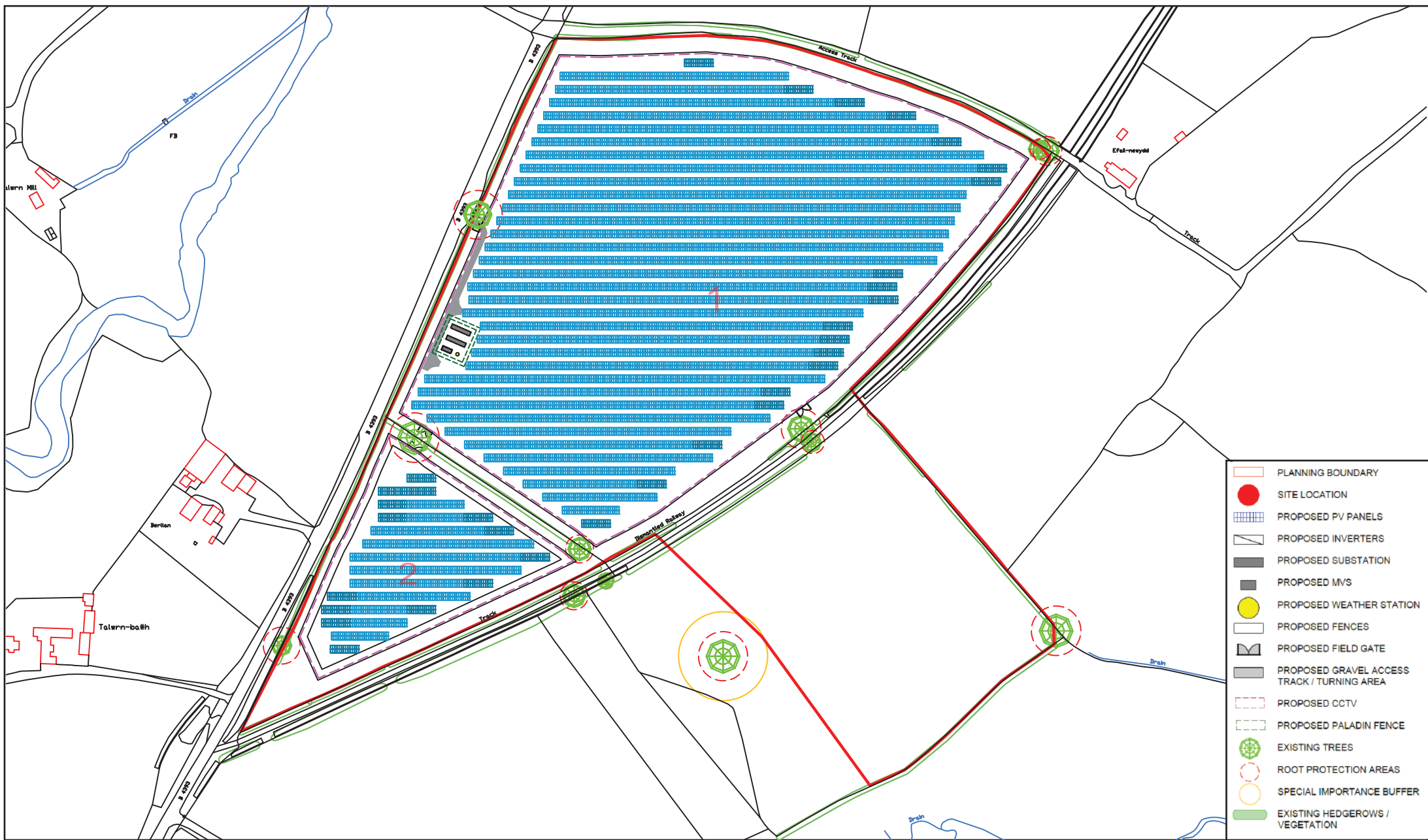


Figure 9. Current Project Design.

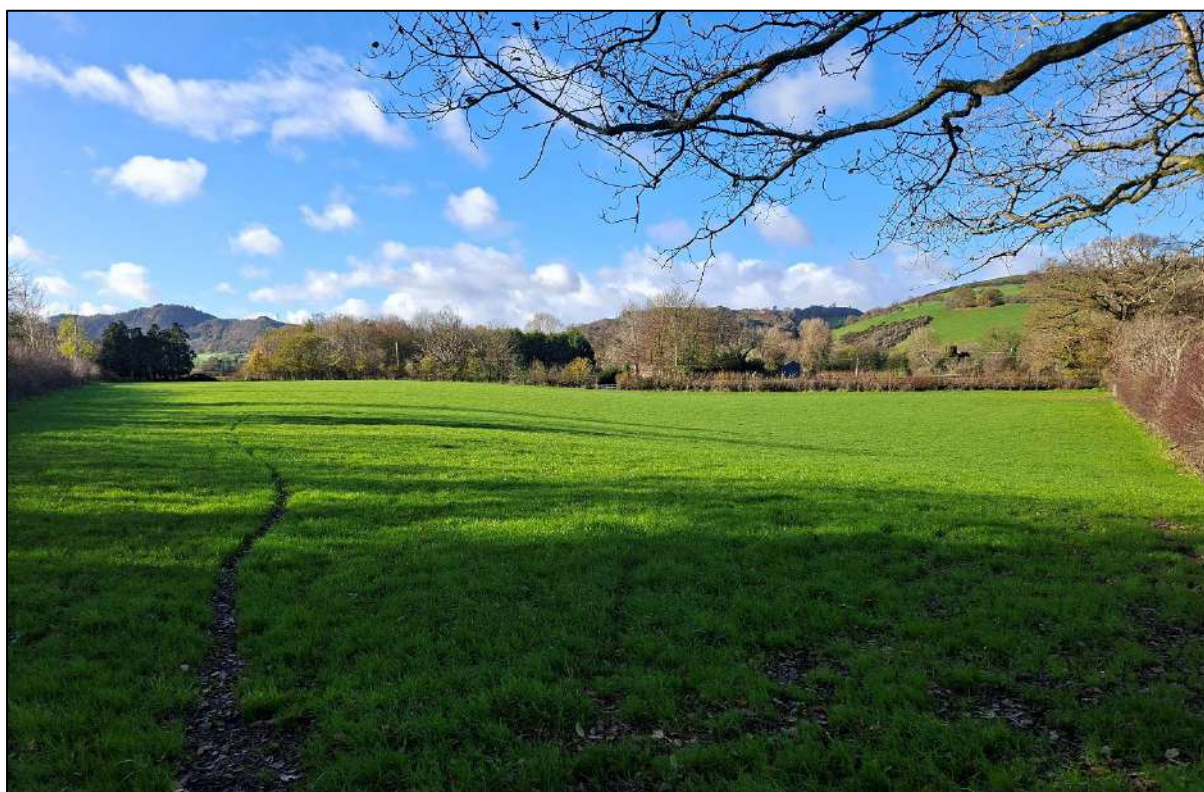


Plate 2. Southern field of proposed development area, looking west from eastern corner.

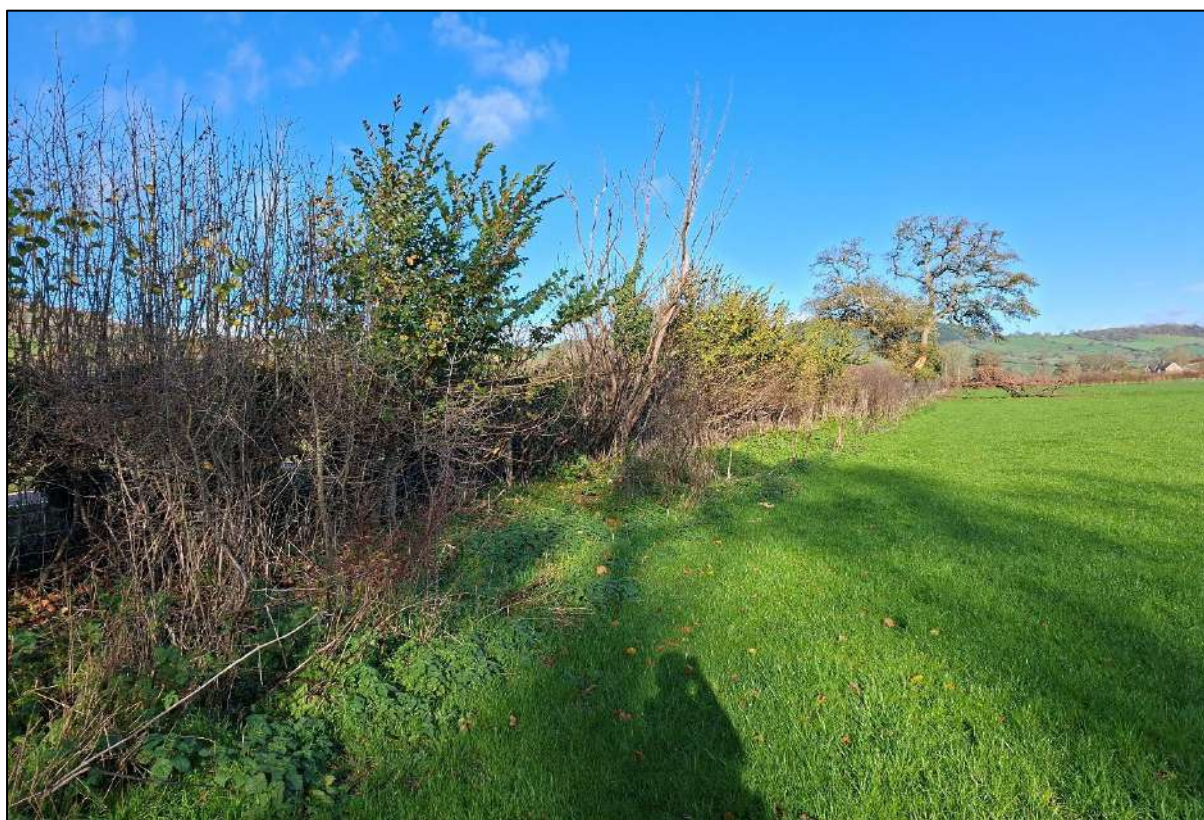

The park lies in the natural, glaciated landscape associated with this part of Montgomeryshire, creating gentle undulating ground which was highlighted by carefully considered tree planting. The park is roughly circular in shape and covers about 60 acres, rising to the summit on which the house was built. No earth-moving is thought to have taken place and no known landscape designer to have been employed. The early history of the park is unclear but it appears that there has been some sort of park in existence since at least the eighteenth-century. The park which survives today dates from 1813, mainly the work of Martin Williams (owner from 1813 until his death in 1856) who seems to have been sympathetic to the ideas of the Picturesque Movement. A drive enters the site from the A490 in the west, replacing an earlier drive which approached from the south-west but which fell out of use at some time in the twentieth-century. There is no lodge and none has ever been recorded. An irregular, curving shelter belt of mixed woodland surrounds the western, south-western and northern periphery of the park. To the south, the park is enclosed by the tree-planted hillside of Bryngwyn Wood, known as 'Madams' Wood'; the actual park boundary here is created by a lane which connects Bwlch-y-Cibau with Glanbrogan. A boundary plantation stands on the east of the park and the open parkland is dotted with mature parkland trees, mainly oak. Ornamental gardens lie to the northeast, east and south of the house and, including the lake, cover about 18 acres. Their early history is unclear. It is assumed that a garden would have been in existence from about 1830. The 1840 tithe map records the area as 'Bryngwyn Pleasure Grounds and Shrubberies'. The presence of mature yews to the south-east and north-west of the house may mark the boundary of an earlier garden; the oldest plantings here, they are possibly associated with the earlier house. The form of the nineteenth-century garden would have been partly dictated by the presence of the ha-ha which is known to have been in position since at least 1825 - its own position possibly determined by the yew trees - when it was recorded on a map included in sale particulars. The ha-ha seems to have retained its divisional role between garden and park at least until 1889 as the Ordnance Survey map clearly shows the 'garden' area clearly confined within it. Photographs of c.1868 show the gardens as lawn planted with shrubs. From 1903, the then owner, Arthur Sandbach, began to develop the east garden. Straight formal gravel paths, possibly reinstatements of Victorian paths, were laid out around the south and east of the house and a long, sloping, straight walk leading east from the bay window to, by about 1910, a small paved terrace. The gardens were extended beyond the ha-ha to the east. Photographs of about 1909 record this work. Today, the northeast front opens onto a raised lawn below which is a rectangular area, possibly once the formal garden. Steps descend on to a more informal tree and shrub planted sloping lawn which supports large clumps of mature rhododendrons, azaleas, Japanese maples and many new plantings, together with trees and roses; these grow along the north side of this area which is defined by a shelter belt. To the north-east a new hard tennis court has been constructed on a raised platform which extends out into the park. To the south of the informal east lawn there is a croquet lawn enclosed by young yew hedges, and next to it a new, rectangular formal rose garden. On the south front of the house a narrow strip of sloping lawn, planted with a large mature larch, runs down to the ha-ha, beyond which a wide, tree planted sloping lawn, sweeps down to the northern edge of the lake. The ha-ha runs about 5m from the south-west corner of the house curving around for about 40m to the east, to the central walk steps. The lake covers about 9 acres and is in two sections. Trees and shrubs grow around it and it is inhabited by wild fowl and ducks. Beneath the walk lies a curving, sunken lawn in the east which covers about a quarter of an acre (0.1 ha). This lawn is separated from the stable yard above [PRN 79668] by a small arboretum. Informal grass paths run through this area and on the east side of the lawn there is an extensive rock garden which appears to date from the 19th century. This has been largely replanted but still contains a stream with small cascades and sets of stone steps. The garden at Bodynfoel Hall dates from the 1830s, when the house was built. The appearance of the original garden is unclear, but from a watercolour painted in the 1860s it seems that sloping lawns descended to the ha ha, unadorned apart from an area of shrubbery on the east side. 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Summary

This Specification details the proposal for a Desk-Based Assessment (DBA) associated with the proposed 7 MWp solar farm at Talwrn Bach, Llanfyllin, Powys, SY22 5LQ. This Written Scheme of Investigation (WSI) has been prepared by Archaeology Wales for Pegasus Group on behalf of Fuse Renewables Ltd.

1. Introduction

- 1.1.1. In September 2025, Pegasus Group on behalf of Fuse Renewables Ltd (henceforth – the Clients) commissioned Archaeology Wales (henceforth – AW) Ltd to carry out an Archaeological Desk-Based Assessment (DBA) associated with a proposed 7 MWp solar farm at Talwrn Bach, Llanfyllin, Powys, SY22 5LQ - National Grid Reference (NGR) SJ 17648 18931 (Figure 1-2).
- 1.1.2. This WSI provides information on the methodology that will be employed by AW during a DBA and site visit associated with the proposed development. The methodology set out in this WSI has been agreed with Heneb Clwyd Powys Archaeology Planning Services (Heneb CPAPS) in its capacity as archaeological advisors to the local planning authority.
- 1.1.3. All work will conform to the Standard and Guidance for Historic Environment Desk-Based Assessment (CIfA 2020) and be undertaken by suitably qualified staff to the highest professional standards. AW is a Registered Organisation with the CIfA.

2. Site Description

- 2.1.1. The proposed development site covers approximately 12.1 hectares and comprises three separate parcels of greenfield agricultural land. It is situated around 1km east of Llanfyllin, Powys, in the vicinity of Talwrn Bach Barn (SY22 5LQ) – Figure 1-2.

- 2.1.2. The surrounding landscape is predominantly rural, characterised by open fields, hedgerows, and dispersed farmsteads. Access to the site will be obtained directly from the B493 road, which runs along the western boundary of the proposed development area.
- 2.1.3. The underlying geology is defined by the Allt-tair-ffynnon Formation, composed of siltstone and mudstone interbedded, formed during the Ordovician Period. Superficial deposits vary across the site. The eastern field and the eastern parts of the other fields are underlain by till (Devensian, Quaternary Period). The western fields are characterised by alluvium (clay and silt) of Quaternary age, while the central northern area is associated with glaciofluvial deposits of sand and gravel, also dating to the Quaternary Period (BGS 2025).

3. Objectives

- 3.1.1. The primary objective of the DBA will be to assess the potential impact of the proposals on the historic environment by means of a detailed desk-based study and site visit. This will help inform future decision making, design solutions and potential mitigation strategies. The aim will be to make full and effective use of existing information in establishing the archaeological significance of the site, to elucidate the presence or absence of archaeological material, its character, distribution, extent, condition and relative significance.
- 3.1.2. The work will include a comprehensive assessment of regional context within which the archaeological evidence rests and will aim to highlight any relevant research issues within national and regional research frameworks.
- 3.1.3. This DBA will result in a report that will provide information of sufficient detail to allow informed decisions to be made which can safeguard the

archaeological resource. The information could then be used to determine further archaeological investigation or appropriate mitigation strategies for any archaeological remains within the area to be implemented. Preservation *in situ* will be advocated where at all possible. Where development or other factors result in loss of archaeological deposits, preservation by record will be recommended.

4. Methodology

4.1. Assessment

4.1.1. The assessment will consider the following:

- a) The nature, extent and degree of survival of archaeological sites, structures, deposits and landscapes within the study area. It will involve the following areas of research:
 - i. Collation and assessment of all relevant information held in the regional HER within a 500m study area around the proposed development area.
 - ii. Collation and assessment of the impact on all Designated archaeological sites (Scheduled Monuments, Listed Buildings, Historic Parks & Gardens, landscapes, Conservation Areas) within 1.5km study area around the proposed development area.
 - iii. Assessment of all available excavation report and archives including unpublished and unprocessed material affecting the site and its setting.
 - iv. Assessment of all extant aerial photographic (AP) evidence. This will include material from the Central Register of Air Photography for Wales, in Cardiff (CRAPW)
 - v. Assessment of relevant archive records held at the County Archives, and as appropriate, site files held by RCAHMS
 - vi. Records held by the client e.g. bore logs, geological/geomorphological

information, aerial photographs, maps, plans.

- vii. Map regression analysis using all relevant cartographic sources e.g. All editions of the Ordnance Survey County Series, Tithe and early estate maps (as available).
 - viii. Place name evidence.
 - ix. Internet sourced satellite imagery and Lidar imagery as available.
 - x. Assessment of the records held at the Portable Antiquities Scheme.
 - xi. Historic documents (e.g. Charters, registers, estate papers).
- b) The significance of any remains in their context both regionally and nationally and in light of the findings of the desk-based study.
 - c) The history of the site, based on the areas of research outlined above.
 - d) The potential impact of any proposed development on the setting of known sites of archaeological importance (this will constitute a brief assessment).
 - e) The potential for further archaeological remains to be present, which have not been identified in pre-existing archaeological records.
 - f) The potential for further work, with recommendations if appropriate for a suitable investigative and/or mitigation methodology.
- 4.1.2. The site visit will be a visual walked search of the proposed development area. The ground surface will be visually inspected for all earthworks, structures and finds. The location of any environmental archaeological deposits, or areas which may have a potential for such deposits, will also be taken into account along with the visible archaeology.
- 4.1.3. All located sites or finds will be accurately fixed by means of GPS. Each individual find or site location will have an accurate NGR reference attached. Where a close cluster of related features is identified a single NGR for the centre of the cluster will be used, and each constituent feature separately described in the text.

- 4.1.4. Digital photographs, including photographic scales, will be taken using cameras with resolutions of 10 mega pixels or above.

4.2. Report

- 4.2.1. The results of the DBA and site visit will be presented in a report and will be detailed and laid out in such a way that data and supporting text are readily cross-referenced. The report will adhere to the Welsh Archaeological Trust's joint Guidance for the Submission of Data to the Welsh Historic Environment Records (2022). The historical development of the site will be presented in phased maps and plans comprising clearly, the outline of the site.
- 4.2.2. Within the report, an attempt will be made to indicate areas of greater or lesser archaeological significance. The sites will be ranked according to their overall archaeological importance (local, regional, and national). The report will also include an assessment of the potential impact of the proposals on historic environment features, together with recommendations for appropriate archaeological mitigation.
- 4.2.3. All relevant aerial photographs, re-plots and historic maps will be included and be fully referenced.
- 4.2.4. The report will specifically include the following:
- a location plan
 - all identified sites plotted on an appropriately scaled plan of the proposal site
 - a gazetteer of all located sites
 - a heritage impact statement and recommendations for archaeological mitigation
- 4.2.5. Copies of the report will be sent to the clients and to the region HER. Digital copies will be provided in pdf format.

4.3. The Site Archive

- 4.3.1. A project archive will be prepared in accordance with the National Monuments Record (Wales) agreed structure and be deposited with the National Monuments Records, held and maintained by the RCAHMW, Aberystwyth, on completion of the report. It will also conform to the guidelines set out in 'The National Standard and Guidance to Best Practice for Collecting and Depositing Archaeological Archives in Wales 2017' (National Panel for Archaeological Archives in Wales 2017).
- 4.3.2. Although there may be a period during which client confidentiality will need to be maintained, the report and the archive will be deposited not later than six months after completion of the work.
- 4.3.3. Other significant digital data generated by the survey (i.e. AP plots, EDM surveys, CAD drawings, GIS maps, etc) will be presented as part of the archive. The format of this presented data will be agreed with the curator in advance of its preparation.

5. Resources & Timetable

5.1. Standards

- 5.1.1. The DBA will be undertaken by AW staff using current best practice. All work will be undertaken to the standards and guidelines of the ClIfA.

5.2. Staff

- 5.2.1. The DBA will be carried out by Susan Stratton, AW Archaeological Consultant.

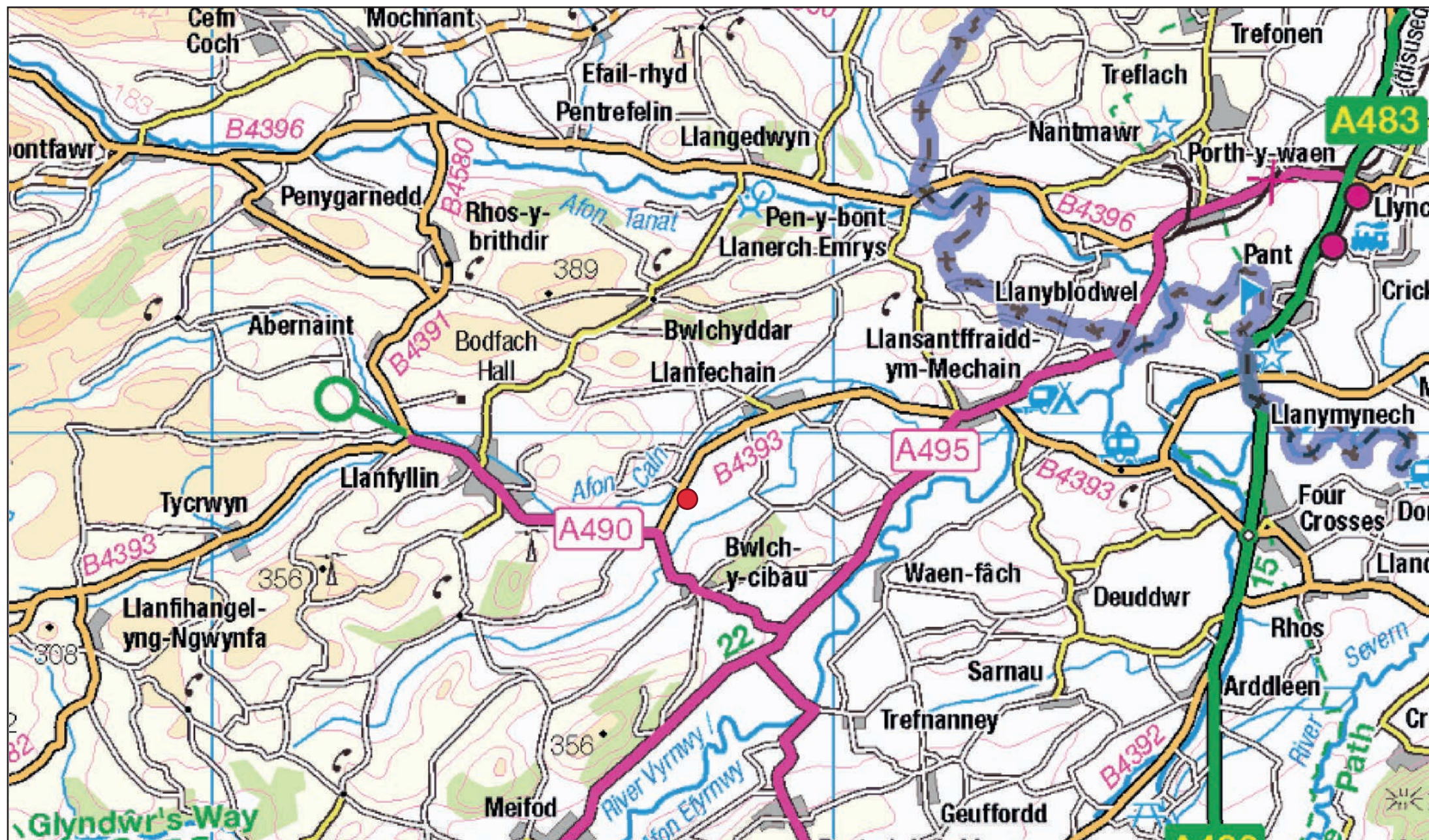


Figure 1. Site location
